He would go on to score another 5 goals and 2 assists in 5 playoff games as he helped the Elite 15s capture the CSSHL Championship. The Calgary Hitmen drafted the Edmonton, Alberta native in the 7th round, 148 overall in the 2017 WHL Bantam Draft. Making the jump to junior in his first year of eligibility as a 16-year old, Riley joins former NAX players Luke and Josh Prokop for his first season in the WHL.

Female Prep:
